Multi Factor Authentication (MFA)

Combining more than one form of authorisation to verify user identity for login or transaction approval: Something You Know + Something You Have + Something You Are

Why MFA?

- Reduces reliance on a single password
- Added protection against weak, stolen or compromised passwords
- Another security layer to protect against hackers
- Once set up is easy to use



Something You Know

- Passwords
- Personal Identification Numbers (PIN)
- Passcodes
- Patterns
- Any other verification based on information which should be known only by the user



Something You Have

- Mobile/Tablet Verification app
- SMS code
- Smartcard
- Physical token



Something You Are

- Fingerprint scan
- Facial recognition
- Retinal scan
- Voice pattern

Outcome

- Another layer of security to keep your accounts, systems and services safer and your legal practice operating more securely
